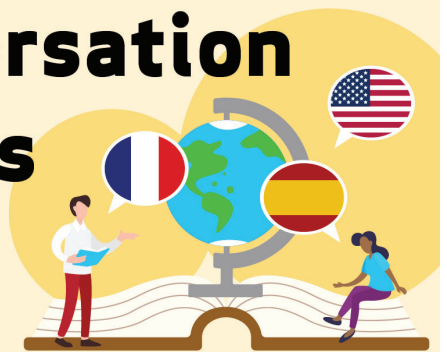
Family Storytime Celebrating Black History Month

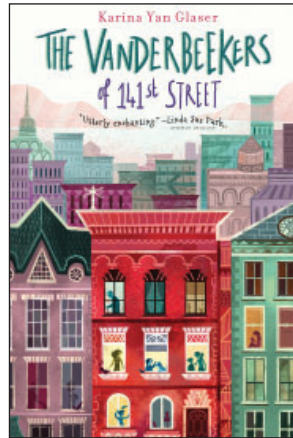
1st Thursday of Each Month 10am, Auditorium

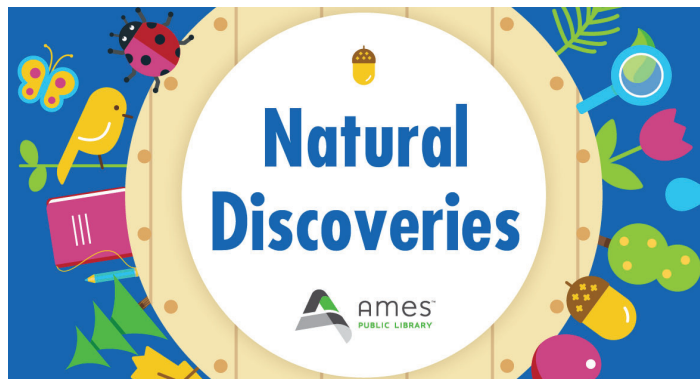

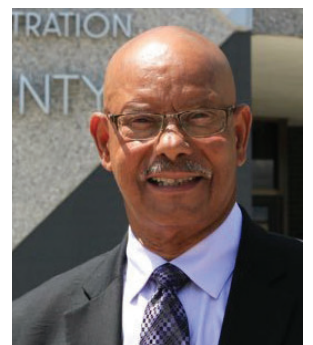
Sharing Our Own Stories: Ames' Black Voices
