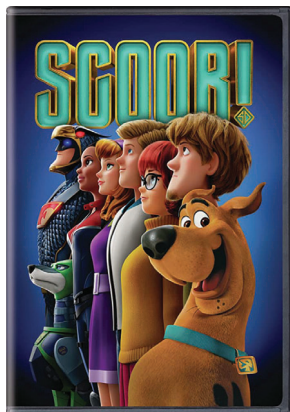

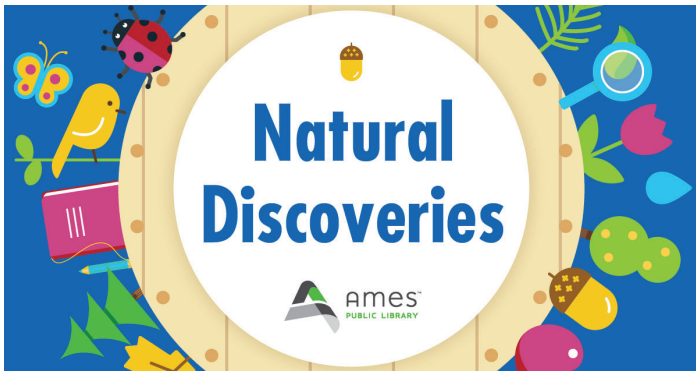
50 Years of Title IX: Reflections and Lasting Impacts on Women’s Sports

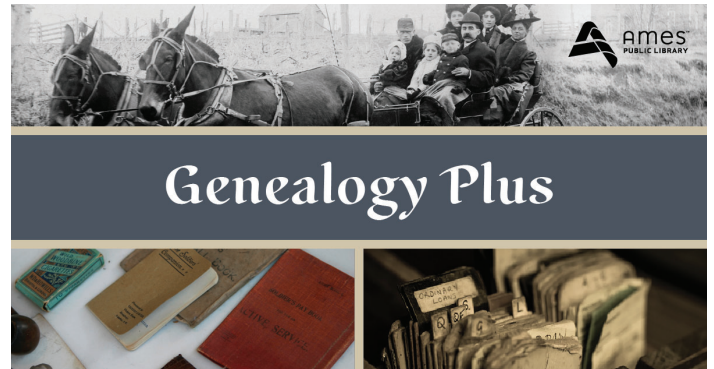
There was historical controversy about the novel because it depicted West Texas in a negative way. It was one of the first novels to give a negative description of the American West in general.

The public symposium will begin with a short musical performance followed by a panel discussion focusing on the prevention of violence against women and holding institutions accountable.

Panelists include world-famous violinist Lara St. John, whose successful campaign to hold the Curtis Institute accountable for her assault when she was a student there made international headlines; Rebecca Stienstra, a senior policy analyst from the Canadian Ministry of Women and Gender Equity; and Assistant Chief Carrie Jacobs of the Iowa State University Police Department. The discussion will be moderated by Dr. Leana Bouffard, Chair of the ISU Department of Sociology and Criminal Justice.

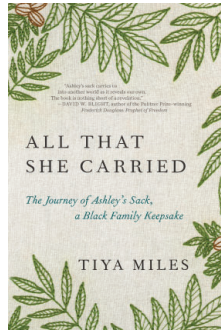

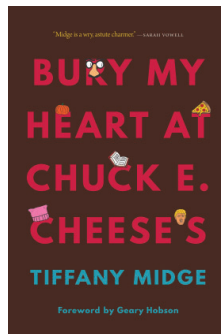

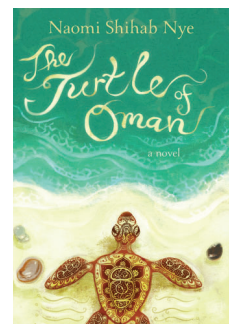
