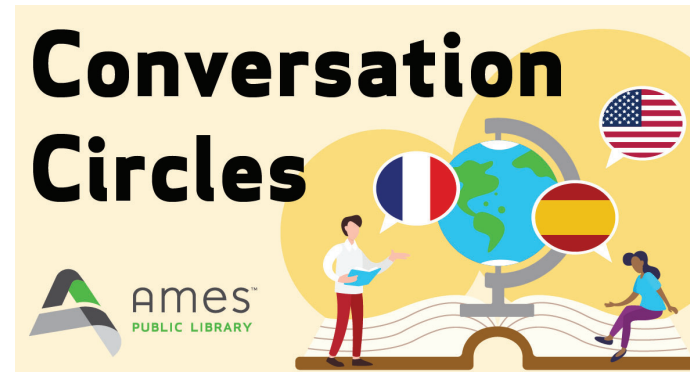
### POKÉMON CLUB
