There will also be a presentation about Ames and other "Carnegie" libraries called "Andrew Carnegie's Riches in Iowa and Ames." See more information on page 10.




#### 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of Each Month (October 3) 10am, Auditorium





No registration is necessary.


#### Teen Anime Club


## Sunday, October 20 2pm, Auditorium
