Between 1998 and 2000, the City of Ames underwent a new downtown comprehensive plan which included terracotta sculptures displayed on pillars along 5<sup>th</sup> Street. Artist David B. Dahlquist designed the sculptures, representing people, places, and organizations which contributed to Ames' history.
