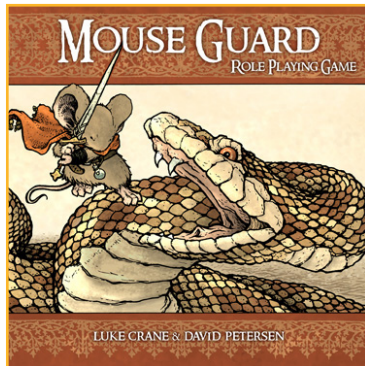


Tabletop RPG
