



Climate Crisis: Facts To Action — The Living Soil (1h 10min)

Monday, November 4, at 6:30pm in Rotary Room

Gather with community members to learn from experts not only why the climate is in crisis, but different ways we can mobilize to reduce greenhouse emissions and sequester carbon. Come watch a 60-minute documentary, which features innovative farmers and soil health experts throughout the U.S.

Our soils support 95 percent of all food production, and by 2060, our soils will be asked to give us as much food as we have consumed in the last 500 years. They filter our water. They are one of our most cost-effective reservoirs for sequestering carbon. They are our foundation for biodiversity. And in the last 150 years, we've lost half of the basic building block that makes soil productive. The societal and environmental costs of soil loss and degradation in the United States alone are now estimated to be as high as \$85 billion every single year.
