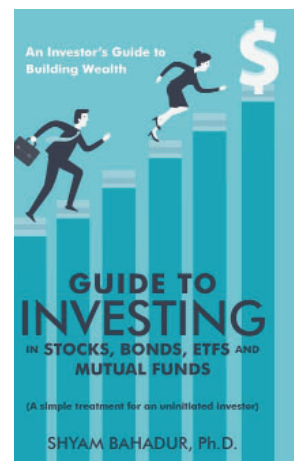

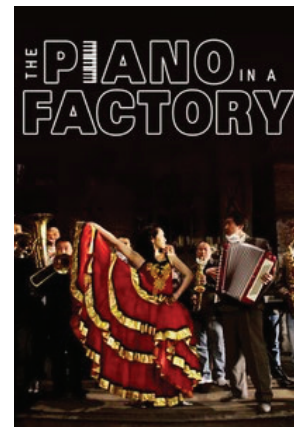
The Piano in a Factory

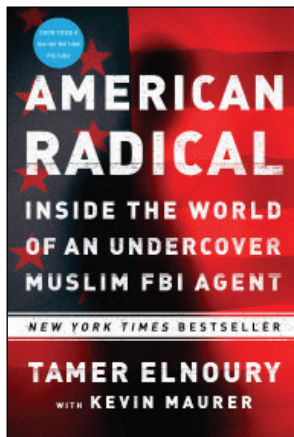

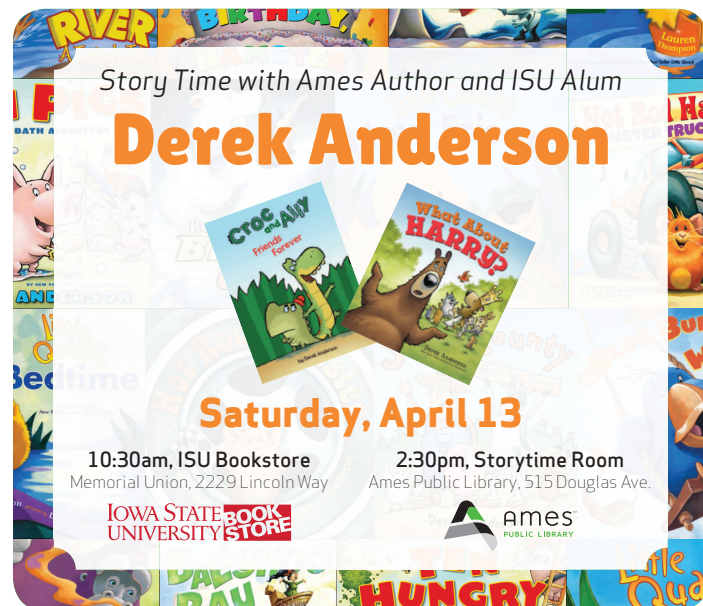
