Tie-dye mask take-away kit

The kit contains-

- White face mask,
- Tie dye, rubber bands,
- Disposable gloves,
- Ziploc bag

How to tie-dye:

- 1. Get your supplies prepared.
- 2. Dampen your mask with water.
- 3. Fold the mask and add rubber bands in different ways to get different tie dye effects.
- 4. Once you have folded and rubber banded your mask, squirt the dye onto the mask.
- 5. After you squirt the dye on and have it all covered, put the mask into your Ziploc bag with the rubber bands still on it. Leave the mask in the bag for 6-8 hours.
- 6. Rinse the mask in cold water until the water runs clear and no more dye is coming off.
- 7. Wash and dry the mask by itself in hot water to set the colors.
