Different New Year's Traditions

- In Greece, people hang up onions around their home to symbolize growth in the New Year.
- In the southern United States, people eat Hoppin' John, a dish with black eyed peas and rice, for luck!
- In Estonia, people want to eat a lucky number of meals on New Year's Day. You might eat 7, 9, or even 12 meals!
- In Brazil, people jump over 7 ocean waves and make a wish for each one at New Year's.
- In China, people wear lucky colors like red for the New Year.

Take Away Kit: New Year's Eve Party Kit

Bag Contents:

- Plastic Glass
- Candy
- Noisemaker
- Paper Plate (with 2 slots cut in it)
- Paper Strip
- Glitter Glue

Directions for New Year's Eve Countdown Craft:

- Decorate your paper plate with glitter glue. You can also use other craft materials that you may have around your house.
- Take the strip of white paper and write the numbers 0-10 on it, starting with 10 at the top and 0 on the bottom.
- Take the number strip and place in the 2 slots on the plate so only one number is showing and the rest of the numbers are behind the plate.
- When counting down, pull the number strip down to reveal the next number.
- Use the countdown, noisemaker, and glass to celebrate the New Year!
